Awards Presented at 15th Annual Capstone Design and Competition Tuesday, April 20, 2021

Sarnia, ON – Award winning projects of the 15th annual *Capstone Engineering Design* and *Competition* have been announced. More than 60 students from the Department of Chemical and Biochemical Engineering at Western University competed virtually in *Capstone*, co-hosted by the Western Sarnia-Lambton Research Park and Western Engineering on Monday, March 29 and Tuesday, March 30.
